<p>Sun Valley Red Maple <i>Acer rubrum</i> 'Sun Valley' Red maple cultivar with superior branch structure Brilliant red in the fall</p> <p></p>	<p>Pawpaw (set of 2) <i>Asimina triloba</i> Delicious yellow fruit Two recommended for pollination</p> <p></p>	<p>Buttonbush <i>Cephalanthus occidentalis</i> Ball-shaped, creamy white flowers Butterflies find nectar irresistible</p> <p></p>
<p>Northern Red Oak <i>Quercus rubra</i> Offers great shade, dense crown Yields acorns. Grows two feet per year for 10 years</p> <p></p>	<p>American Filbert (Hazelnut) <i>Corylus americana</i> Forms rounded thickets Provides tasty nuts</p> <p></p>	<p>White Fringetree <i>Chionanthus virginicus</i> Long drooping clusters of fragrant, fringe-like white blooms</p> <p></p>
<p>American Smoketree <i>Cotinus obovatus</i> Smoke-like flower. A gnarled limb structure and dark, flaking bark. Fall leaves magnificently colorful</p> <p></p>	<p>Sweetgum <i>Liquidambar styraciflua</i> Deep, glossy green star-shaped leaves turn yellow-purple-red in the fall</p> <p></p>	<p>Bucks Unlimited Swamp White Oak <i>Quercus bicolor</i> 'Bucks Unlimited' Fast growing, heavy yield of acorns Preferred by wildlife</p> <p></p>
<p>Tuliptree <i>Liriodendron tulipifera</i> A fast-growing tree, produces tulip-shaped flowers Vibrant yellow color in the fall</p> <p></p>	<p>Elderberry <i>Sambucus canadensis</i> Edible, flowering Attracts pollinators Black elderberry fruits</p> <p></p>	<p>Downy Serviceberry <i>Amelanchier arborea</i> Small tree, white early spring flowers, brilliant red fall color Edible berries, attracts pollinators</p> <p></p>

BAREROOT SEEDLINGS - approximate size: 6" - 18"

<p>White Pine <i>Pinus strobus</i> Long, soft needles Commonly used as Christmas trees Fast-growing evergreen</p> <p> 10 pack</p>	<p>Norway Spruce <i>Picea abies</i> Fast-growing spruce Branches droop as tree matures Windbreak/wildlife shelter</p> <p> 10 pack</p>

CONTAINER BLUEBERRY BUSHES - Group of (3) 2-year in 1 gallon pots

Sweetheart: Early-ripening northern variety. Blooms late, but ripens early. Very large fruit.
Patriot: Mid-summer variety. High quality berries with outstanding dessert flavor.
Bluecrop: Late season harvest. Cross of Bluecrop and Berkeley variety. Firm berries, good shelf life.
