Let's Wade In!

For 16 years, the Geauga and Portage Soil and Water Conservation Districts have offered the Advanced Wonders of Watersheds (WOW) workshops as valuable, affordable, and rewarding teacher trainings. This summer's workshop will include watershed studies at Old Woman Creek Estuary, with a special focus on empowering students with knowledge and hope in our changing climate.

Through outdoor investigations, hands-on activities, field exploration, and curriculum resources, this workshop will take an in-depth look at freshwater & climate science and ways to effectively integrate these topics into the classroom. Teachers will learn about climate change challenges and behavioral solutions - including backyard & schoolyard composting. New this year, thanks to a Go Green Community Grant from Geauga-Trumbull Solid Waste Management District, participants will also receive composting resources, lessons, and even a bin to help them get started!

Each day will take us on new adventures to enhance our skills and sense of wonder. One, two, or three optional graduate credit hours are available through Ashland University. Open to educators of all grades and disciplines - enrollment is limited and the deadline to register is June 1st!
