Container Trees and Shrubs - approximate size: 1' - 4' in 2-3 gallon pots

Silver Maple

Acer saccharinum

A quick-growing tree with yellow leaves in the fall and clusters of small flowers in early spring.



Redbud

Cercis canadensis

A small to medium-sized tree with a broad crown and bright purple-pink flowers. Colors range from red to green to yellow.



Indigobush

Amorpha fruticosa

Thick bush with velvety leaflets. Flowers small, purple to dark blue with yellow stamens.



Carolina Allspice

Calycanthus floridus

A shrub with reddish-brown flowers and a sweet fragrance. Fruit is persistent into winter as an urn-shaped brown seed pod.



Kentucky Coffee Tree

Gymnocladus dioica

Large, pollution-tolerant tree suitable for urban environments, with white flowers in early summer.



Pawpaw

Asimina triloba

Tree with dark purple flowers in spring, edible fruit in the summer, yellow-green fall color.



Eastern Red Cedar

Juniperus virginiana

Aromatic tree. Color varies from green to blue. Tends to brown in winter. Pale blue fruits occur on female plants.



Sweetbay Magnolia

Magnolia virginiana

Fragrant and flowers deciduously, changing from white to bronze-purple.



Elderberry

Sambucus canadensis

Multi-stemmed shrub, fragrant white flowers with blue-black edible fruits harvestable by early fall.



American Sycamore

Platanus occidentalis

Wide, tall, shade tree, with a massive trunk and branches. Brown fall color.



Quaking Aspen

Populus tremuloides

A fast growing tree with yellow fall color. Soft pleasant sound of "quaking" leaves. Smooth, greenish-white bark.



Sweet Birch

Betula lenta

Light green leaves turning dark green throughout summer and golden yellow in fall. Sweet wintergreen scent.



Bur Oak

Quercus macrocarpa

A great shade tree with its massive trunk and branches hosting dark green leaves and acorns.



Bareroot Seedlings - approximate size: 12" - 18"

White Pine

Pinus strobus

Fine, feathery needles, fast-growing, long-lived. 6-yr transplants (10 pack)



White Spruce

Picea glauca

Long-lived, pyramidal evergreen. 6-yr transplants (10 pack)



Container Blueberry Bushes - Group of (3) 2-year in 1 gallon pots

Duke: Harvest all summer long, pink flowers in the spring, and vibrant fall foliage.

Nelson: Late to mid-season bush yielding large and sweet berries. Cold hardy.

Huron: Harvest early to mid-season. Medium blue fruit with a superior flavor that is sweet and low in acidity.
